Settlement Background

- Household count 4412
- Density 147 du-Ha
- Located off Lansdowne Road Khayelitsha
- Settlement age +20 years old

Background on Emergency

- Fire occurred 31/12/12
- 792 dwellings destroyed
- Displacing 3200 people






THE RESCUE PLAN

The fire that occurred necessitated a quick response and an expedited plan of action referred to as the BM Section Rescue Plan which is being over seen by the Urbanisation/Informal Settlements Department within the Human Settlements Directorate

- OR Tambo TRA (Temporary Relocation Area)
- BM Section TRA
- Busasa IDA (Incremental Development Area)
- BM Section Spatial Reconfiguration Plan





OR TAMBO TRA

- 6m x 3m temporary dwelling structure.
- Pre assembled wall panels made up of corrugated metal sheeting and thermal insulation on light weight steel framework
- Wall panels anchored to 100mm concrete surface beds (in-situ, precast pavers can be used as alternative)


- 141 TRA Structures completed in 14 days
- Structure can be assembled by 3-4 unskilled labour with manufacturer's supervision.
- Water and sanitation provided at a 1:4 ratio





BM SECTION REBLOCKING

- 3m x 3m temporary dwelling structure.
- 5 x 76mm x 76mm x 2.7m timber poles ,9 x 76mm x 50mm x 3.0m timber poles, 5 x 3.3m x 610mm and 20 x 2.4m x 610mm (cover) galvanised corrugated steel roof sheets, 1 x wooden batten door,1 x 600mm x 600mm glazed wooden window, and consumables.
- 420 Structures completed in 14 days (30p/d)
- Structure can be assembled by 3-4 unskilled labour with no supervision required
- Water and sanitation provided at a 1:4 ratio











BOSASA INCREMENTAL DEVELOPMENT AREA





BOSASA INCREMENTAL DEVELOPMENT AREA

- 26sqm dwelling structure.(technology allows for additions)
- Pre-assembled wall panels made up of corrugated metal sheeting and thermal insulation on light weight steel framework
- Wall panels anchored to 75mm concrete surface beds (insitu, precast pavers can be used as alternative)
- 20 dwelling units completed per day
- +1000 dwelling units to be completed in 6 Months
- Structure can be assembled by 3-4 unskilled labour with manufacturer's supervision.
- Internal water and sanitation provided at a 1:1 ratio







CIVIL ENGINEERING SERVICES INSTALLED

> ROADS

- Internal gravel roads have been provided to the site, whilst the entrance to the development has been constructed to black top standard.
- GRAVEL PLATFORMS & OVERLAND STORMWATER DRAINAGE
- ✓ the newly constructed platform allows for overland storm water run off.

> WATER RETICULATION

✓ Formal under ground water infrustructre has been installed/constructed to service the development.

> SEWERAGE RETICULATION AND TOILETS

✓ Formal under ground reticulation installed,Sanitation will be provided at 1:1 ratio (internal toilets)

> EMERGENCY TOP STRUCTURES

✓ Beneficiaries will be provided with a 26 m² emergency housing structure, which consists of a prefabricated light gauge steel structure with corrugated cladding. Each structure will be fitted with an internal toilet and wash basin.

ENGINEERING SERVICES INSTALLED

PROVISION OF ELECTRICITY TO DWELLINGS

✓ The site is within the Eskom Supply Area. The City has engaged with Eskom to provide electricity to the site. All structures will be provided with an electrical connection via a 'Ready Board' and a pre-paid meter.

✓ FENCING

 \checkmark The entire development will be fenced with a concrete palisade fence.
